The latest from hiverton is the part'culas of a melce between. Drs. Razee and Wouds, both heretotiore peaceable and respected citizene of that place. It appears firm the news we have been enab.ed to compile, that the two men were trying to settle some neighborhood talk which was afloat, concerning them, and the conversation waxed to high wurds, a clinch and squabble, in which both secured pieces of boards, and Woods hit Razee a glancing blow, which telled bim to the ground in a sebseless condition, and it was some hours befure he recovered his senses A number of physicians were called but we are unabis to get their opmion as to the extent of the wound. Sown after the affray, Mr. O'Sullivan swore out a warrant for Woods, and after examing numerous witnesses, and having something of ac excited trial, Justice Mitchell held the prisoner to appear before the distriset court, at the first term, and ordered him tarned over to to the sheriff, without fixing any bail.

While we regret that such an affair should have taken place, and shall not attempt to justity or ceusure either party, we cannut but question the proprietyof holding the prisover without bail, at the expense of the county. "All men shall be bailable except fur capital crime, premeditated or wifful murder," and in no way does this casa appear to us to be under this head. It caunot but cost the cuunty a large amounu as it stands now, and we hupe to see something done to relieve the county of the expenses, which must actrue out of the case.
