Bloomington which passed the Schate recently was brought up in the House, as a committee of the whole one day last week, and after considerable discussion reported favorably by the committee. This is the only State Road asked for during the entire session strange as it may seen, and why this bill should meet with so much opposition we are unable to discover, unless it is because it does not start from the right point on the B. & M. R. R. It interceds a State Road in Kansas directly south of Kearney, and is in every way a practiable route, running through as large settlements as any route and connecting Kansas with the best shipping point in western Nebraska, making it a very important route for the Junction 21 and the country through which it runs.
