Five hundred residents of Sussex County have died in wartime, while in the service of their country. A complete, organized list of these honored dead has never existed -- until now.

My project for the Sparta History Fair was to compile as accurate and complete a list as possible. Snell, The New Jersey Herald (microfilm, 1898 and 1973), Record of Union Soldiers from Sussex County, Mrs. Ralph Decker, Official Register of Officers and Men of New Jersey in the Revolutionary War, Wm. S. Stryker, and History of Sussex County, Charles E. Stickney.

The following monuments were visited: monuments located in Franklin, Vernon, Sparta, Andover, Sussex, and East Stroudsburg.

Rather than constructing a physical display of these names, I chose to spend my available time in research. Everyone of these people that I have listed, along with those men who survived the wars, should be honored and commemorated for their sacrifices for the safety of the U.S.


Dear Mr. Muti:
