—Before commencing this work we were admonished of many difficulties sure to be encountered, and we laid our plans accordingly. Now when we are done—strange to say—not one of the difficulties named as “bug-bears” arose, and so far as the kindly disposition of ALL the people is concerned—with only four exceptions—it was all that could be desired. Two of the exceptions are noted under the head of Churches and schools. Another was a refusal of all information at No. 205 s First East, while a boot-de-jection was administered to the canvasser at 156 e Second South. In the latter case, perhaps the method employed was the proper one, as there are those whose brain can be reached by a “stern-chaser,” quicker than any other.

—It must be remembered that in order to find a name one should know the correct spelling of it, as the same name is frequently spelled in more than one way. UTAH AS A SUMMER RESORT—At the risk of its being said, “Your remarks are out of place in a directory,” we cannot help recording a few of our conclusions after a sojourn of two months—June and July—in Salt Lake City.

—Our American people by hundreds of thousands, during the months of June, July and August, seek the mountain resorts of New England, New York, the Alleghanis, the St. Lawrence River and the Western Lake country, the Yellowstone, Colorado, Sierra Nevada and Cascade Mountains, besides crowding the fashionable resorts of the Old World. Few, if any, ever think of Utah and its attractions. Why? True the overland traveler “takes in” Salt Lake City while en-route across the continent, spending a day or two, seldom more. One never sees or hears of any of these thousands with their “Summer Houses,” “Family Cottages,” and tented camps in Utah. Why is it? Is it for the want of natural attractions? or the climate? or the difficult access? or the Markets? or the cost of living? We answer No! to all these questions. From our knowledge of most of the famous resorts named, and something of Utah, we are fully convinced that within a radius of fifty miles from Salt Lake City there are a greater variety of natural attractions—including hot, sulphur, soda, and medicinal springs, grand mountain scenery, with the eternal snows, to say nothing of the great Salt Lake, the “dead sea” of America—than can be found at any half dozen, combined, of the now famous and well patronized summer resorts in America or the world.

But who knows of these things outside of Utah? Every resort in the world advertises its attractions but Utah. With the towering Wasatch on two sides of the city why should not drives be constructed beside which, the far famed "Mount Royal" of Montreal would be as a molehill. The cost would be trifling. Why not, Mr. John Beck, bring the water of your famous hot springs into the city and establish here, where the sojourners can enjoy the luxuries afforded by two of the best conducted hotels between Chicago and San Francisco—the Continental and Walker—the grandest Sanitarium in America? With the clear, pure atmosphere of this locality, the thermometer seldom over 85 in the day time; with cool nights and an unusual healthy climate, marketing cheap, fruit abundant, hotel charges reasonable—where can be found a more attractive Summer resort than Salt Lake City, to-day. Yet, as we have suggested, and could suggest further, it can be very much improved by the citizens, and be advertised to the world.

—I have in my mind—suggested by this article—the publication of a system of tours—say of one, two and three days' run from this city, giving the time required, the cost of the trip, together with the attractions. Six or eight tours could be profitably planned, and we suggest that some of Utah's "clever" scribes undertake the work; but if they will not we MAY attempt the task ourselves at an early day.

—From Ogden, I would plan several tours, taking our genial friend Beardsley's Broom Hotel—where everybody stops, when visiting Ogden—as a base. Make these conductive tours, if you please, and they will tend to make Utah's attractions favorably known throughout the length and breadth of the land.

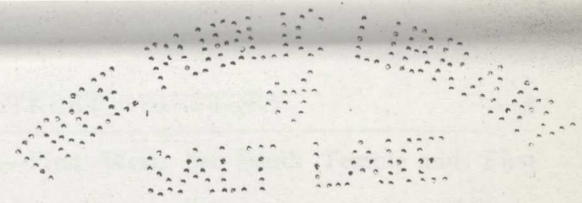

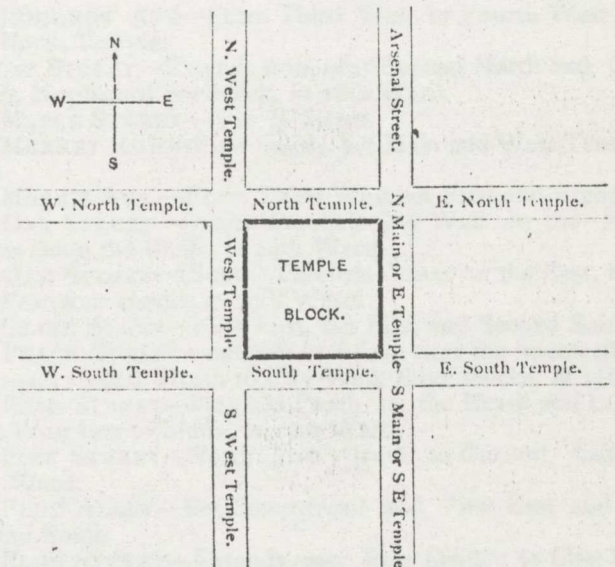

PLAN OF PRINCIPAL STREETS.

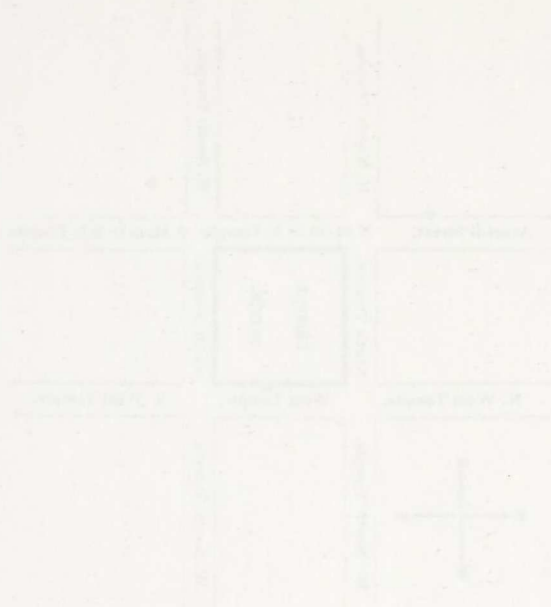
MAIN STREET—Is on the Salt Lake Meridian—is down on our large map as "East Temple."—The residence and business numbers on Main street run north and south from South Temple, extending north from South Temple to North Temple and Arsenal streets, and south from South Temple to the city limits. The numbers north are followed by the letter "N," those to the South by "S."

The parallel streets to the East of Main street (thirteen) are designated by numbers, as "First East," "Second East," etc., and the residence and business numbers accordingly.

The parallel streets to the West of Main street (eleven) number from West Temple, as "First West," "Second West," etc., but the residence and business numbers commence at Main street.

Streets in the Northwestern part of the city, north from North Temple (fifteen), are designated as "First North," "Second North," etc.

INDEX

WEST TEMPLE—Is the first street west of Temple Block, and extends south from First North Street to the city limits. The residence and business numbers run north from South Temple, two blocks, and are designated as "N" West Temple, and south from South Temple, as "S" West Temple.

NORTH TEMPLE—Is the first street north of Temple Block, and extends west from Canyon Road, near City Waterworks, to the city limits. The residence and business numbers run east and west from Main or East Temple Street.

SOUTH TEMPLE—is the first street south of Temple Block, extending east and west to the city limits. The residence and business numbers east of Main, or East Temple, are followed by the letter "E." those to the West "W."

East from Canyon Road and north from East South Temple, the streets running north and south are designated by letters, commencing with "A," eastward to "V", the city limits. All intersecting streets, running north and south, are numbered from "1" to "11"—to the bluffs.

ALMOND STREET—Extends from Currant to Apricot, one block, bet Centre and Locust, in 19th Ward.

APPLE STREET—From the intersection of West and North Temple—north one block to Currant—in 17th Ward.

APRICOT STREET—Extends east from Locust to City Wall, three blocks in 19th Ward.

Arsenal Hill, head of Arsenal street.

ARSENAL STREET—Really an extension of Main, or East Temple, north from North Temple to Grove, two blocks, in 17th Ward.

BACK STREET—Called on map "City Wall" in 19th Ward.

BUSBY'S ALLEY—Second South, bet First and Second East.

CANE STREET—Extends from the intersection of First West and Fifth North, east to City Wall one block, in 19th Ward.

CANYON ROAD—From East North Temple it follows up City Creek, in 18th Ward.

CENTER STREET—Extends in a Northwest direction, from First North and Arsenal Street, in 17th Ward, six blocks, to Fifth North and Cane Street, in 19th Ward.

CITY WALL STREET—Extends, Northwest from Canyon Road, near City Water Works, to the intersection of First West and Sixth North, in 18th and 19th Wards.

CLIFT ROW—From 356 to 366 West Temple, in 7th Ward.

COMMERCIAL STREET—Runs North and South one block in length, from First to Second South, bet East Temple or Main Street, and First East, in 13th Ward.

FIR STREET—Parallels Cane on the North and Extends from First West to Bluffs, three blocks in 19th Ward.

CURVE STREET—As the name indicates, curves east, north and westward, from First North to Strawberry, in 18th Ward.

FOLSOM AVENUE—First West, bet South Temple and First South, in 14th Ward.

FRANKLIN AVE—Runs North and South one block in length, from First to Second South, bet First and Second East, in 13th Ward.

FULLERS HILL—Tenth East.

GRAPE STREET—First East parallel with Apple, extending from North Temple to Currant, in 17th Ward.

GROVE STREE—Extends East from Arsenal, one block, in 17th Ward.

JENNINGS' AVE—From Third West to Fourth West bet South and North Temple.

LOCUST STREET—Extends from near Second North and Currant to Quice, Northward one block, in 18th Ward

MAPLE STREET—Now K Street.

MARKET ROW—First South, bet Main and West Temple, North Side.

MORRIS AVE.—From Third West bet First and Second South.

OAK STREET—(North) Parallels City Wall on the East, three blocks along the Bluffs, in 19th Ward.

OAK STREET—(South) Parallels Center on the East, bet Currant and Pear, four blocks, in 19th Ward.

OLIVE ALLEY—First East, bet First and Second South.

PEACH STREET—extends east from near the intersection of First West and Fourth North to City Wall, three blocks, in 19th Ward.

PEAR STREET—Parallels Peach to the North and extends from First West east to Bluffs, in 19th Ward.

PINE STREET—North from Grove to Currant, half block, in 17th Ward.

PLUM ALLEY—Bet Commercial and First East and First and Second South.

PLUM STREET—Extends east from Quince to City Wall, three blocks, in 19th Ward.

PUGSLEY'S ROW—Victoria Place.

QUINCE STREET—An extension of Locust, north to Pear, half block, in 19th Ward.

STRAWBERRY STREET—East side Arsenal Block from Curve to Currant streets, in 18th Ward.

VINE STREET—A crooked way from near Arsenal to Currant, in 17th Ward.

VICTORIA PLACE—First East, near Second South, in 13th Ward.

WALKER'S ROW—Rear Walker Opera House.

WALL STREET—Same as "City Wall."

WASHINGTON AVENUE—Small street from Third East, bet Fifth and Sixth South.

REGGELS ROW—From 245 to 259 w Fifth South, in 7th Ward.

STRINGFELLOW'S ALLEY—Sixth South, near First East, in 8th Ward.

SOCIAL HALL ALLEY—Near Social Hall, First East, near First South.

THE BINDER

CITY GOVERNMENT.

The Municipal Government of Salt Lake City is vested in a City Council, composed of a Mayor, five Aldermen—one from each municipal ward, and nine Councilors.

A municipal election is held every two years, on the second Monday of February, at which time there are elected one Mayor, five Aldermen, nine Councilors, one Recorder, one Treasurer, one Marshal, and one Assessor and Collector. All other officers are appointed by the City Council and hold office during the pleasure of that body.
