Also a tract called "London," containing 40 a. more or less. Wit: Thos. White, Robt. Polk. Ackn before Thos. White and Robt. Polk, Justices. Receipt of Cha. Dickinson, R.D.C., for alienation fine.

22 Old 4/Aug 21 1767/William Smith, Senr. of Cor Co, planter, to his son Olive Smith: Negro slaves. Wit: Thos. White. Ackn before Thos. White, Justice.

John's (the Indian Settlement); Andertons or Andersons Branch; and Jemmy Cohunck who lived on the other side of the said Branch.

Deposition of John King, aged about 80 years, states that he heard Mary Cratcher, Oliver Hacket and John Thompson the eldest all late of Dor Co, decd, often say that the branch about half a mile below Cratchers Ferry was called Francis Anderson or Francis Andertons Branch, that the land above the said Branch to Cratchers Ferry was always deemed the Indians' land and that the Indians had a settlement between the said Branch and Cratchers Ferry.

Also states that Oliver Hacket late of Dor Co, decd, told him that the branch about 1/2 mile below Cratchers Ferry was called Franks's Branch and that it was the bounder of the Indians' land, and that the said Oliver Hacket knew this because "Francis Anderton settled his Cozin John Franks at the mouth of the said Branch." States that the said Edward employed a certain Wilkinson to survey the same, and that Wilkinson began the survey at the head of Checocone Creek and ran thence to the head of a branch near Andrew Lord's, which branch has been called Bryans Branch and at other times Roger Fowlers Branch. Also says that he believes that Mary Cratcher lived under the Indians by a lease and that he has always understood that a Branch about 1/2 mile below Cratchers Ferry was called Franks's branch, and that the neck of land below or to the southeastward of said Branch was called Franks's Neck and that the Indians generally resided in the said neck and not out of it.
