22 Apr 1721	William Hall is born in Bristol Parish, Amelia Co., VA	Bristol Parish Register..., by Boddie, p. 312
December 1723	Ann Bott is born. She is baptized 1 Feb 1724 in Bristol Parish, Amelia Co.	Ibid., p. 280
circa 1737	Ann Bott marries Judah Israel	Daughter Mary Israel's birth year is estimated from her marriage bond as 1738, as the word "spinster," (over 21) is used
20 Mar 1740	Abraham Green sells 200 acres at Deep Creek, Amelia Co., to Judah Israel	Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 1, p. 279
21 Nov 1740	Slave Jemmy, owned by Judah Israel, is judged by the Court to be twelve years old	Amelia Co., VA Order Book 1, p. 129
20 Aug 1741	Judah Israel obtains a patent for 195 acres at Winticomake Creek	Careful reading of the 1759 deed of sale for Mary Willson's (inherited) 195 acres shows that it is the same property, and that she is therefore the only child (or only surviving child) of Judah's marriage to Ann. Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 7, p. 63, and Library of Virginia's catalog card image for Judah Israel's land patent
17 Feb 1742	Judah Israel sells his 200 acres at Deep Creek to Walter Childs	Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 1, p. 450
18 Jun 1742	Ann Duffey, widow of John Duffey, late of Henrico County (VA), sells 135 acres at Smacks Creek to Judah Israel	Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 1, p. 391
24 Oct 1743	Judah Israel sells 135 acres at Smacks Creek to Samuel Goode. Wife Ann relinquished her dower. Recorded	Deed may have been recorded just before or just after Judah died Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 2, p. 5

26 Oct 1743	Judah Israel sells his slave Jemmy to Thomas Bott	Judah must have known he was dying. By selling Jemm(y) before he died, he gave Thomas Bott clear title to the slave Amelia Co., VA Judgments, Box 2, 1741-1744, no manila file folder, barcode BC1160422
Nov 1743	Judah Israel dies	There are many judgments against his estate, and a sheriff's sale is held. Amelia Co., VA Order Bk 1, pp. 251-263
		Thomas Bott is Ann Bott's father. He takes possession of "Jemm" after Judah Israel's death, rather than just after the purchase of the slave, likely so his daughter Ann would still have the use of Jemm in the meantime Amelia Co., VA Order Bk 1, p. 253
ca 1744	Ann Bott marries William Hall, her second husband	
1746	William Hall purchases property at Smacks Creek	He is a neighbor of George Wilson (d. 1753) Possibly Mary Israel and John Wilson met as children at Smacks Cr.
4 Sep 1751	Bevills of Chesterfield Co. sell 200 acres at Winticomake Creek to Edward Tanner. The land is bounded by several neighbors, including "Judea Israel," indicating his property has not been retitled yet. This deed is unsigned by Joseph Bevill	Ann is already with William Hall, so her name does not appear here. Mary Israel is not yet 21, so her name does not appear here, either Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 3, p. 212
23 Apr 1752	Joseph Bevill signs this time. Neighbor is "Judah Israel"	As above Amelia Co., VA Deed Bk 3, pp. 301-302
22 Jun 1759	Marriage bond of John Wilson and Mary Israel in Amelia Co.; William Hall is surety	William Hall and John Wilson signed. Both John and Mary Israel are over twenty-one. No consent was necessary

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7 Nov 1763	John Wilson and William Hall signed a promissory note together as witnesses (authentic signatures)	They were in Amelia Co., and some of William Hall deeds are witnessed by John Wilson, most likely A206701 Promissory note, Amelia Co., VA, Thomas Roberts to Peter Webster Original document at Library of Virginia's State Records Center
1 Jan 1770	Thomas Bott makes a deed to Ann Hall, "his daughter," formally giving to Ann several slaves, including "one Negro man named Jemm, one Negro woman named Dilsey with all her increase..." In the deed Thomas Bott references "a boy named Charles which the said Thomas Botte hath given unto Mary Willson, wife of John Willson." He also states that if the husband of Ann should attempt to sell, rent, etc. her slaves, her brothers have the right to take the slaves over and put them to use only for Ann	Chesterfield Co., VA Deed Bk 6, pp. 224-225
6 Aug 1776	Thomas Bott reconfirms this arrangement when he writes his will	Chesterfield Co., VA Will Bk 3, pp. 87-91
after 6 Aug 1776	Mary (Israel) Wilson, wife of A206701, dies	Her last child, Daniel, is born ca 1775 (judging from his tombstone in Louisville, KY). From her grandfather Thomas Bott's will of 6 Aug 1776 we know that Mary was still alive on that date
26 Mar 1777	John Wilson signs a slave exchange document with Leonard Cheatham	John Wilson records this document on 9 Nov 1778, when Leonard Cheatham dies. John has remarried, to Tabitha Cheatham, by 26 Mar 1777. [In Leonard Cheatham's will (1776) Tabitha is still referred to with her maiden name]

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15 Sep 1778	William Hall signs the marriage bond for Mary Israel Wilson (daughter of John Wilson A206701)	She has been living with William Hall, who calls her his "grand daughter," and she will marry Barkley Elam
30 Oct 1778	William Hall writes his will, in which he speaks of his two (unmarried) granddaughters, Mary Israel Wilson and Ann Wilson, saying they are "both daughters of John Willson of Mecklenburg County."	Mary Israel Wilson, granddaughter, will not inherit slave Jenny until after the death of William Hall's wife, Ann. That death occurs before 22 Nov 1787, when her will is proven. Ann Wilson, granddaughter, is to receive a slave, Nancy Amelia Co., VA Will Bk 3, pp. 199-200
11 Feb 1785	Ann (Bott) (Israel) Hall writes her will, describing her daughter as "Mary Israel Wilson," and her granddaughter as "Mary Israel Elam"	Possibly Jenny is deceased, as Ann gives Nancy to Mary Israel Elam. She leaves to Ann Wilson a divided part of her seven slaves only if her daughter Ann Archer does not have grandchildren. Amelia Co., VA Will Bk 4, pp. 123-124
1787 census	One of John Wilson's slaves in Mecklenburg Co., VA is noted as "Charles"	This is most likely the slave inherited by Mary (Israel) Wilson, wife of John Wilson A206701, from her grandfather, Thomas Bott
22 Nov 1787	Ann (Bott) (Israel) Hall's will is proved	Pritchett, p. 2582
11 Feb 1796	The inventory of John Wilson, A206701, includes a slave, "Charles a man"	Charles is still alive in 1796, and he is a grown man now Mecklenburg Co., VA Will Bk 3, p. 330
