Jugtown African Methodist Episcopal Church/Graveyard	Wa. Co.	William J. Huyett obtained the 16 acre tract where the church stood in 1857 (Wa. Co. Deed IN 11-795). In 1871 he began selling off lots to local white & colored people. First mention of the church is in Wa. Co. Deeds 76-548 & 80-39 (1877) which mention bordering the church property. No deed has been located for the church lot & graveyard which is about ¾ acre. No church building remains. Samuel Piper Burial Records refer to it as Church Graveyard at Jugtown near Ponds ville (Colored). The records show 9 named stones with the earliest Nov 1872 and the latest June 1896 and lots of other graves with no stones. Find A Grave list the names with no location for the graveyard. Next to 10737 Crystal Falls Drive Hagerstown MD. Beall Family Col. Samuel Beall Jr. 1713-1778 Wife	Wa. Co.	Find a Grave list Col. Samuel Beall Jr. buried in Beall Cemetery at New Dumfries. The tract New Dumfries is the land of his father John Beall which is in PG. Co. near Bladensburg which was patented in 1729. Col. Samuel Beall Jr. purchased the tract Kellys Purchase (Wa. Co.) from the estate of Thomas Kelly. In 1778 Col. Samuel Beall Jr. dies (Wa. Co. Will A-12) and leaves the land where I now live known as Kellys Purchase to my wife Eleanor Beall. In 1783 Kellys Purchase 206 acres (Wa. Co. Deed C-416) is sold by her son Samuel Beall to John Clagett. John Clagett married Anne Beall (daughter of		

Eleanor Brooke Beall 1716-1800		Samuel Jr. & Eleanor Beall). In 1788 John Clagett sold the land to John Middlekauff (Wa. Co. Deed E-738). The land is on the northern edge of the Antietam Battlefield. As to the question of burials. No direct proof Col. Samuel Beall or his wife are buried on the Kellys Purchase tract. Eleanor Beall 1800 obituary states “Died at the home of John Clagett 2 miles from Hagerstown”. John Clagett owned the tract Clagetts Luck which is just below Funkstown. John Clagett & Anne Beall Clagett are both buried St. Johns Episcopal Church in Hagerstown. No deeds or wills mention a burial ground. Notes and Queries Historical, Biographical and Genealogical Relating Chiefly to Interior Pennsylvania - Annual Volume, 1897 Page 78 William Henry Egle. Some years ago the writer visited Fort Frederick Washington County Maryland. I knew there had to be a burial ground near. My inquiries with the local people were fruitless. Finally a colored family said there were graves in a thicket a half mile distant. Farmers for generations had ploughed around it and appeared to be ¼ acre in size and was thickly studded with headstones. Many had inscriptions but no longer		

		readable except some with dates the oldest 1768. I visited again a year later and found to my horror the extension of the W.M.R.R. was being constructed through the copse of trees. Orndorff Burial Grounds

Sharpsburg Maryland

Where is Christian Orndorff (1726-1797) and his son Christopher Orndorff (1752-1823) buried? Land owned by Christian Orndorff and Christopher Orndorff involve two separate burial grounds which the Orndorff's reserved rights to. Resurvey on Smiths Hills (Newcomers Mill) & Andersons Delight Property (Mumma Cemetery Antietam Battlefield)

Resurvey on Smiths Hills

(Newcomers Mill)

Christian Orndorff (Blacksmith) in 1762 obtained from James Smith 503 acres the tract called Smiths Hills (Fr. Co. H-244). Deed states except a 100' square foot (10' x 10') burying ground part of Smiths Hills at a marked stone setup on the west side of Antietam Creek. James Smith reserves free passage for himself and his heirs forever.

In 1791 Christian Orndorff sold to his son Christopher Orndorff 303 acres part of Resurvey on Smiths Hills (Wa. Co. G-472). Christian Orndorff reserves free passage for himself and his heirs to said 100 square foot burying ground as often as they shall require.

(This land became the Orndorff/Newcomer Mills on the Antietam Battlefield)

Christopher Orndorff sells the 303 acres to Jacob Mumma in 1796 (Wa. Co. I-764) except two burying grounds

100’ square. Christopher Orndorff reserves free passage for himself and his heirs to said burying ground as often as they shall require. Jacob Mumma Sr. Sells 324 acres to John Mumma in 1831 (Wa. Co. MM-110) except two burying grounds each 100’ square. Shepherdstown Pike Sharpsburg MD. Area of 39.464819° -77.727385° Note: Drums Along The Antietam by John W. Schildt shows the cemetery was preserved until sometime after the Civil War when it was plowed under.		
Andersons Delight (Mumma Cemetery Antietam Battlefield)		
Christopher Orndorff (1752-1853) obtains the land from Francis Reynolds (Mumma Cemetery Antietam Battlefield) in 1785 (Wa. Co. Deed D-246 182.5 Acres). Christian Orndorff (1726-1797) obtains the land from his son Christopher Orndorff (1752-1853) in 1791 (Wa. Co. Deed G-473) with 50 square foot burial ground (7.5’ x 7.5’). In 1797 Christian Orndorff (1726-1797) wills (Wa. Co. Will A-371) the land to his son Jacob Orndorff (1770-1803) In 1803 Jacob Orndorff dies with the land sold to Jacob Mumma (Wa. Co. Deeds R-74 (1805) & W-638 (1811)) Mumma Lane Sharpsburg MD. 39.478414° -77.741563°		
Christian Orndorff 1726-1797 Elizabeth Hoffman Orndorff 1733-1829	Wa. Co.	Note: Christian Orndorff (1726-1797) will (Wa. Co. A-371 1797) states his wife's mother's name is Elizabeth Cophaver/Copenhaver. Andrew Putman 1716-1777 Wife Catherine Barbara (Bourgey) Putman 1724-1793 Daughter Amelia Putman Wyand 1761-1853 Husband Christian Wyand 1745-1811		(Wa. Co. Patent# 682 142.25 Ac.). Andrew Putman dies in 1777 and the land was patented to his son in law Christian Wyand in 1792. In the will of Andrew Putman (Wa. Co. Will Vol. A-4) he leaves the land to his wife Catherine Wyand. The land comes into the possession of Christian Wyand in 1793 from the heirs of Andrew Buttman/Putman (Wa. Co. Deed H-173) which was a release. Christian Wyand dies in 1812 (Wa. Co. Will C-444). The land then makes it to son in law Jacob Snyder and remains in the family until the last half of the 1800's. Marble Quarry Road Keedysville MD. Area of 39.462147° -77.678772° Note Christian Wyand 1745-1811 & Amelia Putman Wyand 1761-1853 headstone is at Mt. Hebron Cemetery Keedysville MD. From information found it appears they were moved from the farm around 1850 and the graveyard plowed over. Unknown if Andrew & Catherine Putman were moved also or they are still buried on the farm. The following is a transcription printed in the "Antietam Valley Record," April, 1899 - from a copy found by Rev. Ezra Clayton Wyand in an old German Bible in the attic of the Christian Wyand home: The burial ground is "here forty-two yards from the fence on the line south of the orchard, and forty-two yards east from the rocks above the branch of water, and about 150 yards direct south from the house, is the side of the family burial plot, and here lies, to my knowledge, the remains of Rose Wyand, my father's sister. My father's brother, Caleb Wyand, pointing out the plot to me on Jan. 1, 1909, remarked that it used to be enclosed with a paling fence, around which he plowed when a boy, and later when the fence had decayed, and fallen, he plowed across the plot. George Fisher, an old colored man, an ex-slave and war veteran, tells me that he and Pembroke Griffith there years ago plowed out grave stones. Mrs. Amelia Rohrer, a descendant who is now in her eightieth year, tells me that she attended funerals which were held in the barn. I believe Christian Wyand is buried here also."

In 2004, all of the graves were moved to Saint Paul's Cemetery near Clear Spring in a separate section, which is now this cemetery's new home listing 19 memorials. Find a Grave DAR Cemetery Records recorded in the 1930s Edward T. Hayman Farm "The recorder was only able to identify four stones, but there were also 37 graves with plain stones and a lot of graves with no stones." Names listed Jack Troup, Benjamin H. Wachtel, Mary Wachtel & E. Wachtel. 3 additional stones were later identified Elias Kershner (1803-1832), Sarah Wachtel Stine 1801-1845 & Unknown Troup D. 1831 Also see Kershner section All of the graves were re-interred to St Paul's Lutheran Cemetery by Sep 2004 because the home site was purchased by the county and turned into the Forty West Landfill. Inventory Vol. 1-480). In 1761 Elizabeth Graw dies (Fr. Co. Will Vol. 1-168). In the will it mentions son Nicholas Sheaffer and 3 Sheaffer daughters. In 1767 John & Mary Volgomore/Wolgamot and Lodowick & Barbara Kemp had the survey made for the tract Amendment (Fr. Co. Patent #309 774 Acres) which was a resurvey of the tract Resurvey on Batchelors Delight. John Volgomore/Wolgamot and Lodowick Kemp are the sons in law of John Feltygraw. Note: Records show John Feltygraw was also known by the name Valentine Graw. John Wolgamot Sr. Land In 1774 John Wolgamot Sr. dies and leaves the land to his wife Mary Wolgamot. In 1814 Mary Wolgamot dies (Wa. Co. Will B-281) and leaves her land to son John Wolgamot Jr. In 1833 John Wolgamot Jr. dies intestate. The estate goes to Equity Court in 1834 with part of the land sold to Andrew Wolgamot (Son of John Wolgamot Jr.) in 1839 (Wa. Co. Deed TT-845). Andrew Wolgamot sells the land in 1839 and along with the rest of his siblings moves to the Midwest.
