

I wrote you once you said  
if they were any way you could  
help me you would. So I  
am asking you to please see  
why they skiped my house  
and try to help me get my  
light before my children start  
to school so they can have  
good lights to study by. I  
hope the 24, you will be  
elected our senator. I have  
been working for you, I believe  
you will carry Red Rock 100  
over



per cent. For the people all  
around here are thankful  
for all you have done for  
them. If we only had more  
in Washington like you I  
know we could get something  
done. Well I hope you can  
help me get my rights all  
hate to bother you for I
