Biographical Sketch Wardsworth Albert (W. A.) Soders II of Marlin, Texas was the

oldest son of the late William Albert Soders and Ida Harkum Soders. He was baptized at an early age at Marlin Missionary Baptist

Church, where he served as a deacon until his passing.

Albert attended the public schools of Marlin, Texas, completing his high school training at Booker T. Washington High School. He attended Prairie View A&M College, the University of Colorado at Boulder and Huston-Tillotson College, where he received a B.A. degree in chemistry. He received his M.Ed. from Texas Southern University and studied further at the University of New Mexico at Albuquerque. He was Superintendent of Schools in Springfield, Texas prior to serving in the Army Air Corps during World War II. Following the war, he returned to Marlin and operated Soders' Grocery and Market for a number of years. He served on the faculty of Booker T. Washington High School and later Marlin High School, until his retirement in 1975. Following retirement, he operated Soders' News Agency until 1987. As an active participant in the community, he served as

Cubmaster of Pack 298 of Marlin Missionary Baptist Church, He was a member of Hopeful Masonic Lodge #78 F & AM for more than fifty years, where he was secretary for over thirty years. He was a member and former Joshua of Hiawatha Court #183, Heroines of Jericho and Royal Arch Masons. He had also belonged to the Savings Club and Gurley Newton Post #916 American Legion. He was preceded in death by his brother, James O. Soders

and wife, Myrtle Thompson Soders.
