# Mrs. Dorothy Marie Martin-Butler

Mrs. Dorothy Marie Martin-Butler, was called to heavenly glory on August 12, 2003. She was the first of six children born to John and Limmie Houston of Groveton, Texas. Dorothy graduated valedictorian from Groveton High School. She continued her education at Mary Allen College, Texas Southern College, and completed undergraduate studies from Huston-Tillotson College in Austin, Texas earning a degree in Home Economics in 1949. Post-graduate studies were done at Prairie View A&M College. Dorothy met and fell in love with Isaac W. Martin, Sr. from Fodice, Texas. They were married shortly after World War II in June, 1946. To this union, two sons were born, Isaac Jr., and Larry. After college and the birth of her first son, Dorothy began her teaching career in the Fodice public school system in 1954. She later started teaching at Groveton High School in 1958 as head of the Home Economics Department. She later taught at Groveton Elementary School until 1974. Then she began teaching in the Crockett school system, working at the primary and secondary levels until she retired in 1985, with 31 years as an educator.

After the death of her beloved husband, Isaac Sr. in January 1989, she later reunited in marriage to Nay Butler of Houston, Texas until his death in January 1995. Dorothy was a faithful member of White Rock United Methodist Church, Lovelady, Texas. In 1997, Dorothy went to live with her son, Larry and his family in Pearland, Texas due to health reasons. She later joined Good Hope Missionary Baptist Church in Houston, Texas where she remained a faithful member until her death. She was a member of the Order Of Eastern Stars and an active member in church activities at White Rock United Methodist Church, and a constant giver to charities.

Dorothy was preceded in death by her two husbands - Isaac W. Martin Sr. and Nay A. Butler; parents - John and Limmie Houston; and brothers - Leo Houston and Floyd Houston. She is survived by two sons and two daughters-in-law - Larry D. Martin and Celeste A. Martin of Pearland, Texas, Isaac Wesley Martin Jr. and Joyce B. Martin of Darmstadt, Germany; and one step-daughter - Ms. Senora Butler of Chicago, Illinois.
