When she struggled valiantly to get out of bed but couldn't, she simply chuckled, "I'm stuck like Chuck" instead of diminishing her testimony. In fact, throughout her ordeal, **Sis. Lewis** said with regularity, "The Lord is faithful". She believed this, she lived this, and she helped those who knew her further realize this blessed truth.

There was so much we did and could have learned from Sis. Elsie Lewis, for she was truly a remarkable woman. She even provided us with fascinating ways of looking at things. Her cigarette became her pacifier, her bed control became Donald's head-beater, and her life-support machinery, which was a faithful companion, was renamed her boyfriend. A boyfriend who sometimes refused to let her visit places of her choice. For this, she threatened to kick him out.

Instead of kicking her "boyfriend" or anybody else out, Sis. Lewis practiced compassion and patience with him. Elsie Mae never permanently kicked anyone out, deserving or undeserving. Instead, she obeyed Jesus Who teaches us "you gotta love Him", no matter what the circumstances. Somehow, Sis. Lewis managed to do this in such an inviting manner that we, too, gotta love her.

Lewis** leaves many mourn her loss as well as celebrate her home-going. **Mrs. Elsie Lewis** is survived by her son and daughter, Donald and Diamond Lewis; two grandchildren, Marquetta Lewis and Kevin Mask; a daughter, Lillie Pearl Gradney; and a brother, Charlie Henderson.

In addition to her immediate family, **Sis. Lewis** is survived by nine nephews, five nieces, and numerous relatives and friends. She was preceded in death by her husband, Mr. George Lewis; brother, Mr. Jerry Henderson; sisters, Mrs. Evelyn Baldwin and Mrs. Rosie Genus.
