## REFLECTIONS OF A LIFE

Mose Monteze Murphy was born December 1, 1918 in Groveton, Texas to the late Mose and Lillie Murphy. He confessed Christ at an early age. Monteze was the second of ten children, and preceded in death by Ludwell, Alzada, Eva, Geneva, Valmenette and two unnamed boys.

He received his education in the Groveton public schools until entering the C.C. Camps, where he worked until entering the United States Army. During his military days, he experienced combat in the Philippines and was honorably discharged.

He returned to Houston, Texas where he met and married the love of

his life Esther B. Yancy on September 16, 1950.

Monteze joined the South Union Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend P.B. Bryant, where he served faithfully on the Usher Board, Director of the Baptist Training Union, and was later ordained as Deacon under the leadership of Reverend S.C. Watkins.. He served as leader of Division 12 until his recent ill health.

His civic involvement included serving as Assistant Precinct Judge for Precinct #240 a number of years, and as Precinct Judge following the demise of Mr. Knight, Precinct Judge.

Monteze was employed at the Good Year Rubber Plant from 1955

until his retirement in 1984.

He was a very dedicated husband, father, grandfather, greatgrandfather, great great-grandfather, brother, uncle, cousin, and a very

family-oriented man.
