The Life of Nathaniel Westley, Sr.

A descendant of Mansfield Harris and Josephine Norman, Nathaniel Westley, Sr. was born on October 28, 1934 in Lacy, Texas, located on Farm Road 3317, four miles North of Groveton, Texas. Brother Westley confessed his faith in Christ at an early age, and was a member of New Hope Baptist Church in Lacy, Texas.

Known by many as Westley or Sonny, he attended school in Groveton, Texas, and graduated from Groveton High School. He enlisted in the United States Armed Forces, where he received an Honorable Discharge from Camp Chaffee Arkansas, on February 18, 1956 for his faithful service. Westley settled down in Lufkin, Texas where he was employed by Texas Foundry. He retired as Supervisor from Texas Foundry, after forty years of employment.

While residing in Lufkin, he united in marriage with his Dear Wife, Katheline Westley. Brother Westley was also and avid fan of the NFL. His favorite teams were the Green Bay Packers, and the San Francisco Forty Niners. Westley was always abreast of current affairs. 
