Obituary

The Life of Rev. Frank Jones

Frank Jones was born in Shepherd, Texas (Drews Landing) on March 23, 1918. He was the sixth (6th) child of ten (10) born to the parentage of Fred and Letha (Griffin) Jones.

He was preceded in death by his mother and father, wife, Helen S. Jones; daughter, Annie Pearl; grandson, Ricco, sisters, Mercy Lee Carey, Letha Roundtree, Josephine Long, Mae Ella Massey; Fannie Wooten; brothers, Fred Jones, Jr. and Andrew Jones.

He was married to Jewel Stanton in 1938 and to this union five children were born; Frank Jones, Jr., Freddie Lee Jones (Bubba) Annie Pearl Sullivan, Othella Johnson and Joyce M. Kirby.

He later moved to Livington, Texas, where he pastored a local church and united in marriage in 1960 to Helen Holmis Shotwell, who was an educator in the local area. She remained faithfully and loving beside him for over three decades until her death on March 16, 1991.

He received his formal education in Shepherd and Cleveland, Texas. He moved to Lufkin and worked in the foundry for a short while before being called to the ministry in 1952. He was ordained Reverend Frank Jones in 1953 by Rev. L. N. Nezl (Moderator). He received his Bachelors of Theology from Union Baptist Bible College in Houston, Texas.

Although his ministry duties carried him from his home church he remained a faithful member and friend to New Zion Baptist Church, from 1953 until his death. He received his fifty year membership award from Rev. Harry E. Fowler on November 23, 1991.

He was the pastor of Shiloh Baptist Church, Lufkin, Texas, from 1957 to 1960 before resigning to split his time on alternating Sundays between two churches for over twenty years, before retiring on January 13, 1996, from both churches due to his failing health.

Mt. Zion Baptist Church, Grapeland, Texas and St. James Baptist Church, Elkhart, Texas. He has extended family and loyal members in both communities.

Rev. Jones was an active member of the Palestine Bowen Baptist District Association where he held several positions and traveled extensively with the organization.

DISTRICT WORK; Served as President of Minister's Conference instructor in District Congress, Vice Moderator at Large of Palestine Bowen Association.

STATE WORK: Served on Foreign Mission Board, served as Leader of the Foreign Mission Board.

He was a member of the Dawn of Light Masonic Lodge No. 79
