#### WHAT WAS THAT NAME AGAIN?

The selection of a Christian name for children usually follow a trend or pattern of the era, as in the 1950's a multitude of "Linda"'s was born. Multiple christian names were very common in the 1800's. Many girls were named "Sarah Ann Elizabeth" or "Mary Ann Elizabeth". On a Civil War service record was listed "William Henry Harrison Herndon", named of course, for President Harrison. The 1860 Manatee County, Florida Census shows "David J. W. Boney". The Bible record in this issue has "Mary Louisa Elizabeth Lanier", "Eliza Anna Magnolia Lanier" and "Edward Oscar Coram Lanier". An early pioneer of south Florida was "Francis Calvin Morgan Boggess".

The most unusual multiple name was seen in the 1860 Levy County, Florida Census. Family #77/72, page 14, lists Joseph and Francis Oglesbey as having a son, age 11, named George W. S. H. J. Oglesbey. The census taker has an asterick by George's name with a note on the bottom of the page which says: George William Sea Horse Johnson Oglesbey.
