Jacob Keen died at Duette on August 30, 1901 and was buried on his homestead in the family cemetery, known today as the Keen Cemetery.

On January 26, 1903, Mrs. Elizabeth

(Miley) Keen, age 68 and a resident of Duette, applied for a widow's pension based on her husband's Indian War service. She gave her residence as Rye, Florida in June 15, 1903

when she submitted an additional application. She received a pension of \$8.00 per month until her death on March 17, 1908. She was buried in the Keen Cemetery.
