JOEL JACKSON ADDISON 1833-1915

Joel Jackson Addison was born on September 2, 1833 at Tallahassee in Leon County, Florida, son of John and Ellen Addison. His parents had moved to Leon County from Bladen County, North Carolina about 1825. In 1848, Joel along with his parents moved to southern Hillsborough County settling in the Manatee settlement along the Manatee River in what would later become Manatee County, Florida. During the Seminole Indian disturbances in 1849, Joel Jackson Addison served as a Private in Capt. Henry S. Clark's Independent Company of Florida Volunteers commanded by William Fisher. He volunteered at Manatee on Sept. 19,
