JOHNSON February 7, 1872. She died October 26, 1877 and on January 23, 1879 he married Janie I. JOHNSON. His second wife died January 18, 1884 and he was married again on November 10, 1885 to Miss Julia HARDEE, daughter of Judge W. B. HARDEE. This last wife and 3 daughters and 3 sons survive.
