The deceased is also survived by his parents, Mr. & Mrs. M. L. SANDLIN of Newberry.

She was born in this vicinity June 27, 1880 and was married to John SANDS in 1899 or 1900. She leaves her husband and a daughter, two sisters, Mrs. M. E.
