we would be negligent in our duty here today if we didn't honor his wife Lucy. Certainly she played an equal roll in this interesting family. After the Civil War to move with her husband and children 300 miles with oxen and wagon to an unknown wilderness to start anew. She must have had a strong understanding heart. I am told that she was of small physical stature being only five feet tall. What she lacked in physical stature she more than made up with her love and dedication to her family and to her dedication & practice of good Christian principles. In these things she stood ten feet tall."

BAPTISMS BY REV. J. M. HAYMAN
