- 4. Mollie Belle McClenithan, born November 23, 1885; married James Howell on April 15, 1902; married 2nd, James M. Keen on Dec. 30, 1916.

Tobias McClenithan died of heart disease on July 18, 1888 at Fort

Ogden. He was buried in the Fort Ogden cemetery.

On July 29, 1890, Henrietta McClenithan applied for a widow's pension based on Tobias' service during the Civil War. She received this pension until her death on February 3, 1926. She was buried besides her husband.
