WILEY HICKS 1821-1890

Wiley Hicks was born in 1821 in South Carolina or Georgia. The 1850 census and his widow's pension application state that he was born in South Carolina and the other census records state Georgia. Wiley spent most of his early years fighting Indians in the Florida Seminole Wars.

His first enlistment was as a private in Captain William B. North's company of Mounted Columbian Rangers in Warren's Regiment of Florida Militia. He volunteered at the age of 16 at Camp North on Jan. 21, 1837. He was mustered in March 29, 1837 at Fort Reed and was mustered out at Camp North on June 5, 1837.

Wiley's second service was in Captain North's Company of 2nd Regiment of East Florida Mounted Volunteers commanded by Col. W. J. Mills. He volunteered at Camp North on June 16, 1837 and was mustered in September 26th. His company was involved in skirmishes with the Seminoles near Fort White, Fort Fanning and Fort Lancaster. He was mustered out December 18, 1837 at Fort Gilliland.

Wiley was a Third Corporal in Captain Robert Sanderlin's Company of the 12th Regiment 1st Brigade of Florida Militia. He enrolled on March 31, 1838 at Fort Brown and was discharged at Fort Brown on July 31, 1838.
