That is to say, first, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Nancy Ann, all my stock of cattle, swollen fork poplar leaf in one ear branded "W", together with all my household and kitchen furniture with all my other possessions during her natural life and at her death it to be equally divided among my four youngest children, Andrew Jackson, Rebecca Ellen, Thomas, Memphis Meridian named as above. To all my other children the sum of five dollars each. I also appoint my beloved wife my sole executor. In witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and seal in Manatee County this 27th day of Jan. A. D. 1867.
